

Sydney Contemporary Orchestra YOUTH SYMPHONY



Led by its Founding Conductor, Artistic & Executive Director, Dr Brian Chatpo Koo, and Assistant Conductor Kayla Flaxman, the SYS offers young music lovers the opportunity to play and enjoy classical orchestral music of all kinds, not only performing but also learning to understand how those masterpieces were constructed, and expanding their orchestral music education training and orchestral music performance experience. The orchestra also broadens their potential music career by building up their orchestral music repertoires, as well as imparting them the value of communication, teamwork, and discipline.

The SYS consists of two training, performing orchestras:

The SCO Youth Symphony Concert Orchestra (SYSCO)

The SCO Youth Symphony Junior Orchestra (SYSJO)

Each orchestra has 40 scheduled sessions (rehearsals and concerts) with carefully selected programs covering a variety of cultural aspects and artistic values. The programme for each concert includes important classical symphonies, classical concertos, among other famous works of great composers, as well as pop songs specially arranged for the program of 'Putting the Fun in Music Training' by the Assistant conductor Kavla Flaxman. These multicultural trainings will strengthening young musicians and is a fantastic performing experience that young musicians will benefit for forever.

Dr Brian Chatpo Koo Artistic Director

Founding Conductor and Artistic & Executive Director Dr Brian Chatpo Koo is a Sydney based musician. Having studied music at the University of Hong Kong and the University of Sydney, Brian was the first person in Australia to receive a PhD degree in music composition.

Supported by the Hong Kong University Grant, Brian also studied music at the International Summer Course for New Music in Darmstadt, Germany, and obtained his Licentiate and Fellowship Diplomas from the Trinity College of Music in London.

As a composer, his compositions have been performed all around the world.

As a conductor, Dr Koo has conducted many symphony orchestras around the world for his compositions' premieres.

He founded the Sydney Contemporary Orchestra in 2013. Together with about 100 Sydney finest professional musicians and a strongly admired volunteer management team, Brian is dedicated to creating a platform where more new orchestral works can be performed, heard, recorded, published and become a part of our music culture, as he believes music development history is written by composers' creativities. To encourage and to reach the pinnacle of this creativity and art, we must through devotion, perseverance, determination, but most importantly through constant performances.

Brian also founded the SCO Youth Symphony, a training arm of the Sydney Contemporary Orchestra, in order to provide professional orchestral training to young musicians, as he believes with classical music training and carefully selected programs covering a variety of cultural perspectives, young musicians can be equipped to broaden their vision and to enhance their understanding of culture, civilisation and human society. Kayla Flaxman Conductor

Kayla Flaxman currently studies a double Bachelor degree in music and in education at the University of New South Wales. She is an enthusiastic artist who aspires to be an influential role model for other people. Kayla is inspired by her relative, a popular composer Nigel Westlake, and aims to be artistically inspiring like him. She started learning clarinet and picked up self-teaching with other instruments such as th piano, guitar, violin and bugle. Kayla's passion influenced her swift flourishing musical skills and with ambitious desires she started selfteaching on the violincello at the age of 14. She soon discovered that the cello was a strong missing part of her identity and so with lessons, she aimed to develop into a professional. After four years of intensive study with Dr Brian Chatpo Koo, Kayla achieved her

Grade 8 AMEB practical violincello certificate and now, a year later, will soon take the AmusA examination.

Kayla's creative abilities have allowed her to win prize money, as well as a scholarship with the Berklee College of Music.

Kayla begun learning the life within the orchestra by being a part of the SCO Youth Symphony. Under Dr Koo's instruction, Kayla guickly grasped orchestral conducting techniques and has been appointed as an Assistant Conductor in 2017. She now continues improving her ensemble skills by performing with the UNSW Orchestra, Sydney Contemporary Orchestra and the Silverwater C3 Church Band, Next year she is determined to form a chamber ensemble for musicians at her university. Kayla sets high goals in life and yearns to achieve a PhD in music and to become an influential artist

Emma Longo Flutist

Emma started playing flute at the age of 8 when she joined the band program at West Pennant Hills Public School. She worked her way up through the school band program and in year 4 was awarded the first ever Senior Band trophy to be given at the school.

Moving on to High school Emma joined the Muirfield High School Concert Band and not long after was her musical experience, Emma's Flute teacher at the time, Ms. Sophie Knox suggested she enquire about a local youth orchestra she had heard of. Emma did just that and in 2016 started playing with the SYS Concert Orchestra.

Emma has performed at many school assemblies and concerts, local fetes, band competitions and eisteddfods. She now studies under

Joshua Haworth, the Concertmaster of the SYS Concert Orchestra, picked up the violin when he was 6, and came to Dr Koo a year later. He has now been with Dr Koo for 11 years and is now preparing AMusA in violin performance. He is currently ranked first in his music class. He joined the SCO Youth Symphony (SYS) when he was 9, he was the first member of the orchestra, and is now currently lead of the first violin section of the SYS Concert Orchestra.

Joshua is in year 12 currently undergoing the HSC at Greystanes High School. His subjects are Music, Mathematics, Ancient History, English and Science.

Kayla Flaxman Rhythm Exercises



The rhythm exercises created by Kayla Flaxman provide an opportunity for the young musicians from the SYS Junior Orchestra to strengthen a range of skills through activities that involve the use of clapping with the hands and tapping with the foot.

The exercises focus on a variety of rhythm combinations allowing our young musicians to understand and experience different rhythmic possibilities that they may encounter in their future studies. Many of the rhythms are based off certain rhythmically challenging sections in each of the pieces performed in the concert today, allowing the orchestra to understand how to clap the rhythms before playing it on their instrument.


The rhythm exercises have introduced to the performers the importance of analysing and understanding the rhythmic notation of a piece before practising it on their instrument. The Junior Orchestra has made a tremendous improvement through the consistent practice of the rhythm exercises. The exercises have strengthened the musicians' sense of coordination and awareness of timing and pulse. The rhythm activities have also aided in their confidence as well as their interaction and connection with fellow musicians. This has influenced our voung musicians to have better communication with each other while performing together as an orchestra.

Edvard Grieg Two Norwegian Melodies

for String Orchestra

Edvard Hagerup Grieg was a Norwegian composer and pianist. He is widely considered one of the leading Romantic era composers, and his music is part of the standard classical repertoire worldwide. His use and development of Norwegian folk music in his own compositions brought the music of Norway to international consciousness, as well as helping to develop a national identity, much as Jean Sibelius and Bedrich Smetana did in Finland and Bohemia. respectively.

Grieg is the most celebrated person from the city of Bergen, with numerous statues depicting his image, and many cultural entities named after him: the city's largest concert building (Grieghallen), its most advanced music school (Grieg Academy) and its professional choir (Edvard Grieg Kor). The Edvard Grieg Museum at Grieg's former home, Troldhaugen, is dedicated to his legacy.



Cécile Chaminade Flute Concertino

Cécile Chaminade was a French composer and pianist known chiefly for her piano music, which she performed on numerous concert tours,

particularly in England.

Chaminade's earliest music studies were with her mother, a pianist and singer. Because her father forbade her enrolment in a conservatory, Chaminade studied composition privately with



1913 she became the first female composer to be granted admission to the Order of the Legion of Honour.

> Although her piano salon music and songs won widespread popularity, her more serious works, which include an opera, a ballet, and orchestral suites, were less successful. especially among critics. Yet almost all her compositions were published during her lifetime. and they sold well.

Benjamin Godard, among others. She gave her first public recital at age 18 and made her London debut in 1892. At her American debut in 1908 she played the solo part of her Concertstück with the Philadelphia Orchestra. In Her music is elegant, tuneful, and often witty, and it is probable that critical evaluations of her music through much of the 20th century were based more on gender stereotypes than on the qualities of the work.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart Symphony No.14

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was a prolific and influential composer of the classical era.

Born in Salzburg, Mozart showed prodigious ability from his earliest childhood. Already

competent on keyboard and violin, he composed from the age of five and performed before European royalty. At 17, Mozart was engaged as a musician at the Salzburg court, but arew restless and traveled in search of a better position. While visiting Vienna in 1781, he was dismissed from his Salzburg position. He

chose to stay in the capital, where he achieved fame but little financial security. During his final years in Vienna, he composed many of his bestknown symphonies, concertos, and operas, and portions of the Requiem, which was largely unfinished at the time of his early death at the age of 35. The circumstances of his early death have been much mythologized.

in A major, K.114



He composed more than 600 works. manv acknowledged as pinnacles of symphonic. concertante. chamber, operatic, and choral music. He is among the most enduringly popular of classical composers, and his influence is profound on subsequent Western art music. Ludwig

van Beethoven composed his own early works in the shadow of Mozart, and Joseph Haydn wrote: "posterity will not see such a talent again in 100 years".
